Ontario 55+ Summer Games Summary (See appendix A)

<u>Ryan Albright</u> – MTCS representative – Games Ontario. Ontario 55+ Summer Games. Evaluations and surveys of the last games in <u>Brantford</u>. 310 responses. Data: Will participate in another games – 87%

Will recommend to another older adult - 88%

Overall positive rating: 82%

Special events and food – 76%, 'okay'.

Food Services – 74% Higher than at other games. Lots of chicken.

Accommodations rating – 76% - Issues – Laurier residence, Five Oaks – did not meet expectations.

Members asking for any reimbursement for poor experience at the Games. Budget decisions like this depend on the County of Brant.

Registration rating – 92% registration system finalized late due to unforeseen challenges.

Competition rating – 67% Sport Managers did not receive proper training. Last minute schedule changes were a challenge. It was an embarrassment.

Transportation Rating: N/A

- -challenged to deliver acceptable level.
- appreciative of participants who gave rides to other sports.
- Transportation planning continues to be a challenge.

Review of Ontario 55+ Game Structure – Review of sports and categories, new sports, optimizing game operations, identifying opportunities for growth.

Question about paying online – making payments directly to Games org rather than going through District/OSGA. MTCS will consult and look into the feasibility of making things more streamlined.

OSGA 55+ Winter Games 2024 Orillia (See Appendix B)

Will LeFrance (GOC Coordinator) - presentation for upcoming Games.

Total capacity: 984. Total medals: 618.

LeFrance presented capacity breakdown per sport.

Hockey has a province wide qualifier hosted by Don Rider. Other sports will have District qualifiers.

Alpine ski, Nordic ski, Skating will be open events. No need for qualifiers.

Registration fees. Single Occupancy: \$300 +HST

Double Occupancy: \$199 +HST

** includes accommodation, food, and transportation to venues.

Standard Athlete fee: @\$129 + HST for anyone who does not need accommodations or transportation.

Not included fees: lift/trail fees, and any other incidental fees that the sport/venue requires.

Timelines: Oct 1 to Dec 1 – Stage 1, December 4- lottery. December 5 to 8 – Stage 2 Registration – GOC will share what is available, medalists from District qualifiers will be invited.

December $11 - 2^{nd}$ stage lottery, if necessary.



December 12 to 14 – stage 3 and 4 registrations.

Transportation

Will provide transportation to venues in the form of shuttle service. Shuttle loops will be established. Will provide transportation to and from Special Events. **NOTE**: Parking downtown Orillia is limited and not all participants will be able to find. Hammond official bus of the games. Support from city busses and Helping Hands for accessible transportation.

Horseshoe Resort, Rama MASK, Barnfield Curling Club, Coldwater Curling Club, Rotary Place, Orillia Rec Centre, Brian Orser Arena.

Best Western, Quality Inn, Champlain, Comfort Inn, Farfield Inn, Day's Inn, Casino Rama, Bayview Wildwood.

100 Days Out event – October 30 – at the Orillia Room, Rotary Place Arena.

Opening Ceremonies - hosted at 2 locations: Opera House and St. Paul's United Centre.

Middle Night – downtown Orillia. Close Mississauga St but restaurants will be open and entertain participants. Planning to ensue and more details to come.

Comment – can contact through phone be more responsive during the event? Yes, more people will be available to man the phones.

Regional Meetings/Games- Daria Thompson

Reinstitute that districts host a regional meeting and invite a member of the OSGA Board to attend and discuss local matters. Regional games are a topic that districts would support. These games are not provincial game qualifiers but planned events that help engage the districts for more participation and opportunities.

Ontario 55+ Summer Games



- Post event survey is conducted after each Ontario 55+ Games.
- Standard set of questions used allows comparison of data
- Survey sent out to all participants with a valid email
- 310 Responses (so far)

Overall:



Data is evaluated to look at the positive sentiment for each question. Percentages represent number of respondents that say it was good or excellent (or its equivalent)

Important to note that the percentages not represented do not necessarily mean it was a bad experience – in many cases the remaining percentage is people who rate it as fair or okay.

- Will participate in another Games: 87%
- Will recommend to another older adult: 88%
- Overall rating: 82%

Special Events – Opening Ceremony



Opening Ceremony Rating: 92%

- One of the highlight of the Games
- Good pacing, good entertainment
- Flag bearer process went well
- Torch and cauldron lighting
- Issues with egress, transportation (more to be discussed)

Special Events – Middle Night



Middle Night Rating: 76%

- Entertainment was 'okay'
- Transportation issues getting people to Paris and back to hotels.
- Food was 'okay'
- Participants could go to one of three areas some confusion as to what was available.

Accommodations



Accommodations rating – 76%

- 80-85% of accommodations were hotels, provided good service, met expectations.
- Significant issues at Laurier residents, Five Oaks did not meet participant expectations.

Food Services



Food Services Rating: 74%

- On the higher end for an Ontario Games especially when meals were provided to participants versus restaurant vouches.
- Too much chicken for participants
- Cold food services area at Brantford
- Availability of snacks

Registration



Registration Rating: 92%

- Overall very positive
- Operational issues behind the scenes:
 - Lack of overall Games knowledge by registration volunteers
 - Sponsor and vendors too far away from main registration area
 - Registration system had to be finalized relatively late due to challenges with other potential solutions.

Volunteers



Volunteers Rating: 91%

- Again, overall very positive
- Operational issues behind the scenes:
 - Volunteers not provided with adequate training
 - Overall lack of volunteers in some areas

Sport Competition



Sport Competition Rating: 67%

- Massive step backwards from 2022
- Sport Managers did not receive proper training for their role
- Results boards at venues only completed at the end of the first day of competition
- Last minute schedule changes were a challenge (e.g., Pickleball team in wrong category, came forward at end of Opening Ceremony)

Transportation



Transportation Rating: N/A

- Brantford/Brant were challenged to delivery acceptable level of transportation services.
- Appreciative of participants who gave rides to other sports to minimize the overall impact.
- Transportation planning continues to be a challenge at these
 Games Needed for some, under utilized a the best of times.

Single Occupancy - \$300 +HST

Double Occupancy - \$199 + HST

- Food Services starting with Dinner on Opening Ceremony night through to lunch on the final day of competition.
- Participation in competition event(s) during Orillia 2024 Ontario 55+ Winter Games
- Opening Ceremony and Middle Night Events

REGISTRATION FEES

Standard Athlete Registration Fee - \$129 +HST

Includes:

- Participation in competition event(s) during Orillia 2024 Ontario 55+ Winter Games
- Ticket to Opening Ceremony event, including dinner
- Ticket to Middle Night Event
- Food service during competition event(s)

Not included:

- Accommodations: Participants can choose to stay at home and travel in each day or select an alternative accommodation option (Short term rentals)
- Breakfast each morning
- Transportation to/from Accommodations

In addition to the registration fees above, additional sport specific fees apply:

- Alpine Skiing \$75 + HST
- Nordic Skiing \$55 + HST

Non-participant registration fee (double occupancy) - \$300 +HST

<u>District Coordinator/OSGA Board Member - \$199 + HST</u>

REGISTRATION TIMELINES

- October 1, to December 1 First Stage of registration
 - Registrations can be completed at any point during this period
- December 4 Stage 1 Lottery
 - Oversubscribed categories will undergo lottery
- December 5 to 8 Second Stage of registration
 - GOC will share remaining availability
 - Medalists from district games will be invited to fill remaining places
- December 11 Second Stage Lottery, if necessary
- December 12 to 14 Stage 3 and 4 of registration
 - Stage 3 and 4 will run concurrently. District 28 will be invited to fill any remaining space, as will participants in other district qualifiers

TRANSPORTATION

- Will provide transportation to Sport Venues
 - Due to a relatively small number of available drivers, this will likely be implemented as a shuttle service
 - We will have shuttle loops that serve certain hotels and venues
- Will provide transportation to and from Special Events and strongly encourage that it is used since Downtown Orillia will not have parking available for all participants
- Hammond will likely be our primary bussing provider and will subcontract with other local companies
- Will have some supplemental coverage from Orillia City Busses, and plan to use Helping Hands for accessible transportation

OPENING CEREMONY

- Will be hosted at the Opera House and St. Paul's Centre
- Orillia Opera House has a capacity of 677
- Dignitary Speeches, Flag Procession, Athlete's Oath, Etc. will happen on stage at the Opera House and be live-streamed to St. Paul's
- Both venues will feature live entertainment acts
- Entertainment acts have not been locked in yet, but the plan is to have multiple shorter acts, similar to the Brantford Opening Ceremony this Summer
- Those attending the Opera House will eat off-site, prior to the Opening Ceremony
- Remaining ~ 400 attendees will be hosted at St. Paul's Centre
- Those who attend St. Paul's will have dinner on site

- Hosted in Downtown Orillia
- Closing a portion of Mississaga St. and working with restaurants/brewery/vendors to activate downtown
