Sudbury 2025 Ontario 55+ Summer Games Update

As some members may be aware, changes have been made to the services that will be provided at the Ontario 55+ Games. Registration costs for the Games are being significantly reduced. The additional changes will include:

- Participants will directly book and pay for their own accommodations at the Games
- Limited transportation to sport venues will be available from designated hotels/accommodations. Participants will be responsible for their own transportation to sport venues, if not using the Games shuttle

• Participants will be **responsible for breakfasts and one dinner** at the Games. The remaining one dinner and lunches will be provided by the Games Organizing Committee

The Sudbury 2025 Ontario 55+ Summer Games are scheduled to take place <u>AUGUST 5th to the 7th, 2025</u>. The Games Organizing Committee for the <u>upcoming</u> <u>summer Games</u> will be providing information about available room blocks and rates to assist with booking your accommodations. 

WOMEN'S HOCKEY – ALIVE and WELL in the OSGA!!

November 25 to 28, 13 teams and 169 hockey players descended on Millbrook for a 3 division (55+, 60+, and 65+) women's hockey tournament. It was an opportunity for women who have the heart to lace up the skates and the good health to step on the ice, a chance to make new friends and play a game they all love.

Teams came from Mississauga to Kemptville, and players came from as far away as Wawa and Sault Ste Marie.

Some fast facts: 4 days, 26 games, 2 games stood at a tie, 14 games decided by a 1 goal difference, 77 goals, 12 shut-outs, and 25 penalties with Bracebridge-Stouville (Braceville) and Mississauga with no penalties at all.

55+ Division – Limestone Lightning finished in top spot, winning 3 of their 4 games. Peterborough Pens had 75% of its team members contributing a goal or an assist throughout their 4 games with Michelle Ward scoring 2 goals and an assist to lead the way as top points getter.

60+ Division – Mississauga and Kemptville both won 3 games, but Mississauga outlasted Kemptville 1 – 0 in the final to claim top spot. Mississauga 60+ Legends had 71% of its team members contributing a goal or an assist. Kemptville had 2 top division scorers, Susan Ritchie with 3 goals and 1 assist and Lynda Kemp with 4 assists.

65+ Division – The Eh! Team claimed top spot with 4 wins. They tallied 12 goals and allowed only 3 goals against. The Eh! Team also had 82% of their team members contributing a goal or an assist. Napanee's Di Drury and Shari Hasler each had 3 goals and 2 assists to lead the way as top points getters in the 65+ division.

No matter the metric used, the tournament was a huge success simply because people showed up with smiles on their faces, fire in their hearts, and great skill on the ice. One arena worker on the last day commented that he watches a lot of hockey and this tournament was great! He loved the passing and play-making.

None of this would have been possible without the hard work and hours spent by Michelle Rosenberg organizing the tournament. Special thanks to her for a fantastic experience. People often say that it takes a village and this is no exception, so a huge thank you to Don Rider, the registration desk crew, the timekeepers, and referees. 
